

Our History

1978 Daybreak was founded in Spokane by a group of citizens from Whitworth Community Presbyterian Church, out of concern for the needs of troubled teens in the community.

1980 Following two years of needs assessment, prayer and planning, Daybreak opened its doors in the basement of the Manito United Methodist Church on Grand Boulevard as an after-school counseling program, admitting 60 teens.

1984 Daybreak opened a 12-bed Inpatient facility on Dyer Road, the only adolescent program in Eastern Washington that could provide residential treatment services to low-income youth.

1985 The Inpatient program was expanded to 20 beds. Daybreak admitted 160 teens.

1987 An Outpatient office was relocated to a new facility on Mission Avenue. The first Summer Program for adolescents was also implemented.

1989 The Spokane Valley Outpatient program was established. By the end of fiscal year 1990, Daybreak had served 272 teens.

1992 An Inpatient treatment contract with the State of Idaho further expanded our service area. 328 young people were served by Daybreak's programs.

1996 The Daybreak administrative office from Grand Boulevard and the Valley Outpatient offices were moved to a new combined location on East Sprague Avenue.

1998 Inpatient and Outpatient programs moved to a 40-bed facility on South Cowley Street. 388 teens entered Daybreak programs.

1999 The Secure Crisis Residential Center, to serve high risk, run-away teens, was opened in Spokane. In Vancouver, at the request of Clark County, a 12-bed Inpatient facility for boys was also opened. Services were made available to 518 young people.

2000 Programs in Spokane and Vancouver admitted 850 youth. Daybreak celebrated 20 years of service to the community.

2002 A remodeled Vancouver facility was increased to a 16-bed capacity. By year's end, Daybreak's services were tendered to 950 teens.

2003 Property and facilities on East Third Avenue in Spokane were acquired for expansion of Outpatient programs and future needs. A new 48-bed facility in Vancouver is in the architectural planning stage. Admissions to all Daybreak programs exceeds 1000 youth.

Daybreak's Mission

The mission of Daybreak is to help teens and families troubled by alcohol and other drug use. We work with adolescents, ages 12-18 and their parents. Over the years, Daybreak has been a pioneer in developing effective counseling and treatment programs in a variety of settings, all uniquely suited to the needs of young people in our community.

Services Provided

Daybreak provides a full range of drug and alcohol treatment services for over 950 adolescents and families each year. Services include outpatient counseling (Spokane and Spokane Valley offices), inpatient counseling (Spokane and Vancouver, Washington) and a Secure Crisis Residential Center in Spokane (for teens who run away from home.)

Daybreak Leadership

Daybreak is a 501(c)(3) non-profit agency, directed by a Board of Directors who oversee overall operations. The board is made up of community volunteers who have a commitment to providing quality treatment resources to the youth and their families within the community. The treatment team is multi disciplinary by design, consisting of Chemical Dependency Counselors cross-trained in substance abuse treatment, mental health issues, and family counseling. All Daybreak staff are specif-

ically trained in working with youth and their families.

Company Profile

Daybreak was incorporated in Washington State. We have three locations serving Spokane and one location in Vancouver, Washington. Daybreak is approved by the State of Washington Department of Alcohol and Substance Abuse (DASA) as an inpatient and outpatient treatment program.

Support from the Community

Daybreak has always enjoyed the strong support of the community we serve. We receive financial support from contracts with the state and local government, from the United Way of Spokane County and from charitable donations of individuals, churches, civic groups and businesses. *Daybreak is committed to providing services regardless of ability to pay.* Donations support counseling services to clients who lack adequate medical insurance and need assistance with the cost of treatment.
